

Places of interest near Bintulu Port

Council Negeri Monument -The Birth Place of the Sarawak Legislative Council

The site marked the place where Malaysia's first and oldest state legislative assembly meeting took place on 8th September, 1867. A centenary stone commemorating the centennial of the historical meeting was erected on this site in 1967 and was further improved to include a clock tower and fountain in 1987.



Kuan Yin Tong Temple

Situated at Kilometre 2 of Jalan Sultan Iskandar, the Kuan Yin Tong Temple of Bintulu is another spiritual building which will fascinate you with its skilfully crafted grand design. Amongst the peculiar features of this unique temple are the rock garden courtyard, man-made waterfall and dragon fencing - all of quality craftsmanship.



Pantai Tanjung Batu

This is a place to enjoy the sun, sea and sandy beaches and just to have fun. It is an ideal spot for family and friends to gather and have a picnic or even go camping, swimming and fishing. Take a break from home cooking and have barbecue here, using the barbecue pits provided.



Similajau National Park

This park provides a great getaway with 8,996 hectares of virgin coastal forest and a stretch of beautiful coastline facing the South China Sea from Likau River in the south to Similajau River in the north. The abundance of flora is matched by various species of mammals and about 230 recorded bird species.



Kampung Jepak and Longhouse

The remnants of the old fishing village at Kampong Jepak is situated on the opposite bank of the Kemena River. During the Brooke era, the town was a small administrative centre. The clock tower here commemorates the meeting of five members of the Brooke government and 16 local chieftains, which led to the establishment of the state legislative body.

Trips to the rarely-visited longhouses along Kemena River can be organised from Bintulu. More than 20 Kemena River longhouses can be reached by road or river within 30 minutes of Bintulu. Iban longhouses are the closest; further upriver are the more traditional Kayan and Kenyah longhouses.



Boustead Cruise Centre (BCC) is a dedicated cruise terminal in Port Klang, Malaysia. Operated by Bestari Marine Sdn. Bhd., BCC is effectively the cruise terminal for the country's capital Kuala Lumpur, one of the world's most-visited cities. It is a port of call for many major cruise lines including Aida Cruises, Royal Caribbean Cruise Line, Princess Cruises, Cunard Lines, Costa Cruises and Star Cruises, among others. BCC is often included in World Cruise itineraries, including that of the Crystal Serenity, Voyager of the Seas, Diamond Princess, Queen Mary 2 and the Queen Elizabeth.

Places of interest near Boustead Cruise Centre

Kuala Lumpur

Petronas Twin Towers

Designed by renowned architect Cesar Pelli, the iconic 88-storey building stands at a height of 451.9m. Go up to the Skybridge, the world's highest two-storey bridge that connects the towers, before ascending 86 storeys up to the observation deck to take in breathtaking views of the city.



Merdeka Square

This square is significant historically as it was here that the British flag was lowered. The Malayan flag was then raised for the first time at the stroke of midnight on 31 August 1957 as independence was declared. The flagpole which holds the Malaysian flag is also one of the world's highest at 100m.



KL Bird Park

Located within the Perdana Botanical Gardens, the KL Bird Park is home to more than 3,000 birds of 200 Malaysian and foreign species. Sprawled over 20.9 acres of greenery, the park's free-flight concept allows birds to fly and breed naturally. Species here include Mandarin ducks, hawk-eagles, hornbills and flamingos.



National Museum

The National Museum was officiated on Malaysia Day, 31 August 1963, and features traditional Malay architecture. Showcasing a large number of exhibits and artefacts, the museum is a wonderful resource centre that traces the history of Malaysia from prehistoric times to the present.



KL Tower

Located atop Bukit Nanas at 421m above sea level, KL Tower is set amidst the 10.05-hectare Bukit Nanas Forest, the oldest gazetted forest reserve in the country. The observation deck accords panoramic views of the city, and within its grounds are other attractions including an animal zone and an aquarium.



Kuala Lumpur Craft Complex

Styled after a Malay Village, this complex is an artists' colony housing handicraft shops, an art workshop, a craft museum and a food court. Watch the artisans as they skilfully create exquisite items from silver and brass or try your hand at batik-painting. Visitors can also buy export-quality Malaysian handicrafts here.



Royal Selangor Visitor Centre

Royal Selangor is the world's largest pewter-maker. It is also the manufacturer of two other luxury brands; Selberan (fine jewellery) and Comyns (sterling silver). The Royal Selangor Visitor Centre gives an insight into the world of pewter with interactive exhibits and games.



Putrajaya

Known as the 'Intelligent Garden City', Putrajaya is Malaysia's administrative capital. Possessing a refreshingly different urban landscape, the city is a clever combination of nature and state-of-the-art infrastructure. Diving around Putrajaya is a feast for the eyes as it filled with eye-catching architecture and bridges.



Selangor

Batu Caves

One of Malaysia's iconic attractions, Batu Caves comprise massive limestone outcrops which are believed to be around 400 million years old. A 42.7m-high golden statue of the Hindu God, Lord Murugan, guards its entrance, while a steep 272-step climb takes visitors to the cave temples at the top.



Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Mosque (Blue Mosque)

Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Mosque is said to be one of the largest in Southeast Asia with a capacity of 24,000 worshippers at a time. It is popularly known as the Blue Mosque for its trademark blue dome and features a combination of traditional Islamic, West Asian, Indian and Malay design elements.



Carey Island

Carey Island is famed for its fresh seafood and the indigenous Mah Meri people who are known to produce some of the world's most evocative wooden masks. Fashioned out of a rare mangrove hardwood called Nyireh Batu, every mask has a story behind it that's related to a Mah Meri ancestral legend.



Little India, Klang

Said to be the biggest Indian enclave in the country, Little India in Klang is a paradise for shoppers who enjoy browsing through Indian-inspired items. The labyrinth of streets along Jalan Tunku Kelana is lined by shops selling everything from traditional Indian outfits, accessories such as bangles, necklace and earrings to garlands made of fresh flowers and home décor items. The town takes a festive atmosphere during Indian festivals when shoppers make a beeline to this town





The terminal is strategically located on Borneo's northwest coast along the South China Sea. It is situated in Kota Kinabalu, Sabah's state capital and also the main commercial and industrial centre. The terminal is also located near several renowned national parks and reserves, as well as the beautiful islands of Sapi, Mamutik, Manukan, Sulug and Gaya.

Kota Kinabalu is also the gateway to Kinabalu National Park, home to extraordinary natural scenery and Mount Kinabalu, the highest peak in Southeast Asia.

Other Info

The limits of the Port of Kota Kinabalu shall be Gaya Bay and waters to the southwest bounded by a line joining Tanjung Aru and the northern point of Pulau Gaya thence a line to Gaya Head including rivers entering same for a distance of 600 feet inland from the mouth of the river.

Places of interest near Kota Kinabalu Port

Tunku Abdul Rahman Park, Kota Kinabalu

Named after Malaysia's first Prime Minister, this marine park encompasses the islands of Gaya, Manukan, Mamutik, Sapi and Sulug. A favourite destination of experienced divers and underwater photographers, the park is home to an abundance of aquatic life and colourful corals.



Kinabalu Park, Kundasang

The first State Park in Sabah, Kinabalu Park also holds the distinction of being Malaysia's first UNESCO World Heritage Site due to its outstanding biological attributes. Situated at 1,585m above sea level, the park is the main starting point of the trail leading to the summit of Mount Kinabalu, the highest peak in Borneo.



Gaya Street (Sunday Market)

One of the city's most interesting markets, the Gaya Street Fair takes place every Sunday from 6.30am to 1.00pm. Located in the central business district, this popular Sunday market comprises hundreds of stalls offering a diverse array of goods, from handicrafts and souvenirs to t-shirts and foodstuff.



Poring Hot Springs, Ranau

Located 400m above sea level, Poring Hot Springs provides a unique opportunity to soak away the aches of the day in the spring's hot sulphuric minerals which are believed to have therapeutic properties. Visitors can also enjoy breathtaking treetop views from a 43m-high canopy walkway.



Mari Mari Cultural Village, Inanam

A walk through this vibrant cultural village is a journey through Sabah's diverse cultural heritage. Here, visitors are invited to step into the traditional homes of its ethnic communities (Bajau, Lundayeh, Murut, Rungus and Dusun) and learn more about them and their way of life.





Kuantan Port is a multi purpose deep sea port in Tanjung Gelang, Kuantan, Pahang, privatised to Kuantan Port Consortium Sdn. Bhd. The Port is operational 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. The port is strategically located in the midst of the fastest growing regions of China and Indo-China. It is the major gateway for trade in the East Coast of Peninsular Malaysia.

Kuantan Port has developed into a major international port in tandem with the rapid expansion of the industrial and manufacturing activities in the East Coast Industrial Corridor. Supported by excellent port facilities and services, a vast market outreach and a strong network of global shipping connections, Kuantan Port is ideal as a petrochemical hub and will be a catalyst for the development of the East Coast Industrial Corridor which is featured as the heartland of the petrochemical industries and a major container terminal for the East Coast Region.

Besides, handling various types of cargo, the port's facilities are also used for the disembarking and embarking of passengers from cruise ships.




Sultan Ahmad 1 State Mosque

Sultan Ahmad 1 State Mosque is located at the heart of Kuantan city. Constructed between 1991 and 1993, the mosque's elegant design is inspired by Ottoman architecture. It boasts a grand dome flanked by four smaller domes and four tall minarets. It is the largest mosque in Pahang and can accommodate up to 8,000 worshippers at one time. Non-Muslims who wish to visit will be given robes and headscarves.



Teluk Chempedak

Located approximately 5km from Kuantan, Pantai Teluk Chempedak is a popular beach retreat with calm waters and beautiful casuarina-lined coastline. A variety of watersports activities can be enjoyed here, such as windsurfing, sailing and jet skiing.



Lake Chini

Malaysia's second largest natural lake is filled with a variety of freshwater fish, while the lush surrounding wilderness is a habitat to a diverse collection of flora and fauna. The lake consists of 13 interconnecting water bodies each with its own characteristics. From August to September, a dazzling display of white and pink water lilies can be seen on the lake's surface.



The Great Mines of Sungai Lembing

Explore the world's deepest and longest underground tin mining tunnel. Restored to its original state back when Sungai Lembing was dubbed the 'El-Dorado of the East', the Great Mines of Sungai Lembing take visitors to the glorious tin-mining era of Sungai Lembing. This educative yet adventurous tour takes you through the many processes involved in tin mining with dioramas, paraphernalia and interactive exhibits. Also, learn about the tin mining industry's contribution to the nation's growth and development in the past.





Kuching Port Authority is the first organised port in the state of Sarawak and was established in 1961 under the Port Authorities Ordinance, 1961. Kuching Port Authority serves as the state's premier port authority and connects numerous shipping lines to the regional hub ports. All its terminals including Pending Terminal and Senari Terminal are in close proximity to the industrial estates such as Demak Laut Industrial Park and Samajaya Free Trade

Zone, hence facilitating easy cargo movement. Kuching Port Authority has grown to be the main gateway for Sarawak's external trade.

Kuching Port Authority is the first Malaysian port authority to have its container handling management system accorded the MS ISO 9002 certification.

Other Info

Senari Port is meant for cruise vessels that cannot be accommodated at Pending in view of the LOA having exceeded 175 metres and will have to be berthed at Senari terminal (where Senari can take in Cruise vessels with a maximum LOA of 200 metres / Draft 7.5 metres). Any LOA of more than 200 metres will have to seek the approval of the Director of Sarawak Marine Department first. If approved, the vessel owner will have to indemnify Kuching Port first after JLS approval before port will agree to receive the vessel into port berth. This is to safeguard the port from any untoward incident arising there from allowing it to berth at Kuching Port and port is not to be blamed for the mishap if it does happen.



Places of interest near Kuching Port

Cat Museum

The museum is on top of a hill called Bukit Siol, 60m above sea level, with beautiful views of the city. Dedicated to the animals from which Kuching takes its name, the museum houses more than 2,000 exhibits, artefacts and statues of cats from all over the world.



Kuching Waterfront

Approximately 1km long, this esplanade stretches along the Sarawak River from the main hotel and commercial heartland to downtown Kuching. The landscaped waterfront is dotted with food stalls and restaurants if visitors want to make a stop and take in views of the Astana and Fort Margherita.



Sarawak Cultural Village, Damai

Known as the "Living Museum", the Cultural Village showcases Sarawak's cultural heritage. Sprawled across 17 acres in Pantai Damai, the village features replicas of buildings from every major ethnic group including longhouses of the Iban, Bidayuh and Orang Ulu and a Melanau tall-house.



Annah Rais Longhouse, Padawan

The Annah Rais Longhouse is a Bidayuh settlement at the foothills of the Borneo Highlands. More than five generations old, the longhouse offers a delightful homestay where visitors can experience the Bidayuh lifestyle first-hand. Activities include spear fishing, rafting on the river and even trying to build the raft.



Bako National Park

Sarawak's oldest national park is only a modest 27sq km but is filled with extraordinary flora and fauna. Known for the beauty of its natural surroundings, the wind, sea spray and waves have carved out intriguing sea arches and sea stacks, some rearing above the waves like a mighty serpent's head.



Semenggoh Wildlife Centre, Padawan

Located within the Semenggoh Nature Reserve, the wildlife centre was originally established to rehabilitate injured or orphaned wild animals, conduct research on wildlife and provide conservation education. Today, it is a centre for the study of Orang Utan's biology and behaviour, as well as a safe haven for these primates.



The Star Cruise Jetty at Langkawi Island, a treasure trove for tourists of all generations, is a gateway to northern Malaysia as well as to Southern Thailand and the beautiful Andaman Islands. Riding on these advantages, the Star Cruise Jetty began operations in August 1997.

Langkawi is an archipelago of 99 tropical islands. It has been accorded the UNESCO Global Geopark status for its stunning landscapes. Guests boarding and disembarking from the jetty are minutes away from the resort paradise Awana Porto Malai Langkawi. From the jetty, guests are just a 5-minute taxi ride away from Underwater World

Langkawi, one of the largest marine and fresh water aquaria in Southeast Asia. They can also visit the culturally rich city centre, Kuah town, which takes just 30 minutes to reach by taxi.

The Star Cruise Jetty has been awarded Statements of Compliance under the ISPS Code, which sets out a framework for cooperation between contracting governments, government agencies, local authorities as well as members of the shipping and port communities to detect and assess security threats and to take preventive measures.





Langkawi Cable Car & SkyCab

The Langkawi Cable Car, also known as Langkawi SkyCab, is one of the major attractions in Langkawi Island, Kedah, Malaysia. It provides an aerial link from the Oriental Village at Burau Bay to the peak of Gunung Machinchang, which is also the location of the Langkawi Sky Bridge.



Eagle Square

Dataran Lang, also known as Eagle Square, is a striking 12 metre-tall sculpture of an eagle poised to take flight. It is displayed atop an elevated platform. Set in Kuah, this prominent landmark is just a five-minute walk from Kuah Jetty, Jetty Point Mall, Taman Lagenda Dalam Langkawi, as well as numerous restaurants and duty-free shops.



Underwater World Langkawi

Set along the vibrant Pantai Cenang beach town, Underwater World Langkawi houses more than 500 species of sea creatures including harbour seals, rockhopper penguins, seahorses, as well as flamingos and mandarin ducks. One of the highlights is a 15-metre walkthrough underwater tunnel, where you can enjoy close-up views of sharks, giant stingrays and green turtles.



Langkawi Craft Complex

This complex is a centre that showcases Malaysian arts and handicrafts such as pewter, batik, textiles, beads, basketry, wood products, jewellery and art. Visitors will get a chance to watch the artists at work and purchase the handicrafts. The complex also houses a Cultural Museum and Wedding Museum.

Mangrove Trip by Kayak

You will paddle through the small jungle rivers while watching the flora and fauna in Kilim river, which is part of Geopark Langkawi. You will visit the bat cave (by boat), the eagle area (by kayak), join a fish tour at the fish farm and a lunch at the floating restaurant Hole in the Wall. The total paddling time will be about 2.5 - 3 hours and you might spot some animals like monkeys, bats, eagles or kites, kingfishers, monitor lizards and snakes and if you are really lucky maybe even some dolphins or otters.



Dayang Bunting Marble Geoforest Park

Langkawi's second largest island, Pulau Dayang Bunting, lies just south of the archipelago. It means 'Isle of the Pregnant Maiden', a name derived from a local legend and for its shape which resembles a pregnant lady. The island spans some 44 sq km and is famed for its freshwater lake. The park is also known for some of the finest Permian marble formations in the world.

Kota Mahsuri

Kota Mahsuri was erected in memory of Mahsuri, the legendary 19th century Langkawi princess. According to legend, Mahsuri was sentenced to death for a misconduct that she did not commit and therefore, she laid a curse on the island which lasted for seven generations. Kota Mahsuri is an ideal place to learn more about the legend. Visitors can also browse around the souvenir shops and food stalls here.

Galeria Perdana

This gallery houses the many awards, souvenirs and gifts that were awarded to Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad, Malaysia's fourth and longest-serving Prime Minister.





Melaka will enchant visitors with its unique history, fascinating antiques and quaintness found nowhere else. Strategically located along the Straits of Malacca, Melaka was once the epicentre of an important trading empire. It is home of the nation's historical and cultural heritage. It received its UNESCO World Heritage City status in 2008.

At the moment, all cruise vessels arriving in Melaka will be anchored at the Melaka River river mouth. The anchorage position is about 2.5km from the pier inside the Melaka River. All passengers will be ferried by shore tenders or ship's tenders from cruise vessels to Parameswara Jetty located along the Melaka River.

The ongoing Melaka Gateway's maritime zone is developing the Melaka International Cruise Terminal with 900m berthing length to welcome more than 6,000 cruisers from around the world with the capacity to hold three mega carriers at any one time. Furthermore,

convenient bus access, highways and a state-of-the-art monorail will link the terminal with the UNESCO World Heritage City and the rest of Gateway Melaka; allowing massive volumes of passengers to travel to their desired destinations with ease.

Places of interest near Melaka Marina

A Famosa Fort

A Famosa is a Portuguese fortress located in Melaka, Malaysia. It is among the oldest surviving European architectural remains in Southeast Asia. The Porta de Santiago, a small gate house, is the only part of the fortress which still remains today.



Taming Sari Tower

Menara Taming Sari (Taming Sari Tower) officially opened for business on the 18 April 2008. Menara Taming Sari is the first and only gyro tower in Malaysia so far. Measuring 110 metres in height, its revolving structure offers a 360-degree panoramic view of Melaka city and beyond.



Replica of Melaka Sultanate Palace

The Replica of Melaka Sultanate Palace is a museum located in Melaka City. The building is a modern reconstruction of the palace of the Melaka Sultanate. It showcases the history of the region.



The Stadthuys

The Stadthuys is believed to be the oldest-surviving Dutch building in the East. The massive bright terracotta-red riverfront building was once the official residence of the Dutch governors and officers. It is part of Melaka town square's prominent Dutch colonial heritage.



Villa Sentosa, Kampung Morten

Kampung Morten, with its beautiful traditional Malaccan houses, is a visual feast. The most prominent abode in this village is Villa Sentosa, which was built in the 1920s. The house is a museum of sorts with a varied collection of artefacts including Ming dynasty ceramics and a 100-year-old copy of the Quran. Situated along the Melaka River, Kampung Morten can be reached via a bridge just opposite the Majestic Hotel.



Jonker Street

Jonker Street is the vibrant heart of Melaka City, where old town houses and shophouses are transformed into cafes, pubs and boutiques. There are also antique shops offering collectibles dating back hundreds of years as well as souvenir shops and hawker food stalls. Jonker Street is liveliest at night, especially during festive seasons.



Baba & Nyonya Heritage Museum

Once the ancestral home of three generations of a Baba Nyonya family, the Baba and Nyonya Heritage Museum offers a glimpse into the life of a wealthy Straits Chinese family, otherwise known as the Peranakan people, descendants of the earliest Chinese migrants to Melaka.





Redang Port is located in Kuala Terengganu, Terengganu, Malaysia. It is a resort island that has been gazetted as a marine park where activities are subject to the provisions of the law under the Department of Marine Parks Malaysia.

Pulau Redang's (Redang Island) main pier is known as Pier Village. It is the driving force for Redang and has various facilities such as airports, health clinic, educational complex, shops and convenience stores. Apart from the Pier Village, there are also jetties built by the Department such as the Gulf Pier Jetty Dive Centre.

Pulau Redang is also one of the stopover destinations for Star Cruise vessels.

Places of interest near Redang Port

Pulau Redang is the largest of nine protected islands that make up the Pulau Redang Marine Park, located 45km off the coast of Kuala Terengganu. This popular island is famous for its numerous dive sites, clear waters and coral reefs that are rich in marine life. The waters around here also hold two historic WWII shipwrecks, namely the HMS Prince of Wales and HMS Repulse. Not surprisingly, snorkelling and scuba diving top the activity list here, followed closely by swimming, jungle-trekking, visits to a turtle sanctuary, boating and canoeing.





As a major point of entry for tourists by sea to Penang Island, Penang Port is now able to receive some of the largest cruise vessels in the world with the completion of the new Swettenham Pier Cruise Terminal in November 2009. The new cruise terminal is designed with a T-shaped berth spanning 400 metres long with a depth of 12 metres

The three-storey high building, which occupies a total area of 15,005 sq. metres, is equipped with the ideal facilities for cruise passengers' arrivals and departures. The terminal is able to cater for larger cruise vessels carrying more than 2,000 passengers and also provide facilities such as shopping lots and several modes of transportation within Penang Island.

With the new Swettenham Pier Cruise Terminal in operation and located within the UNESCO Heritage Site, Penang will not only be a destination for international cruises vessels but also act as a catalyst in the development of the local and international tourism industry.

Places of interest near Swettenham Pier Cruise Terminal

Penang Hill

At 830m above sea level, the hill, also known as Bukit Bendera or Flagstaff Hill, is popular for its cool, fresh climate as well as panoramic views of George Town, the Straits of Malacca and even the mainland. Access to the hill is provided by the Penang Hill Railway, a funicular railway which climbs to the top from Air Itam.



Fort Cornwallis

The history of Fort Cornwallis goes back two centuries to when Captain Sir Francis Light of the British East India Company first landed on the island in 1786. In spite of it being built to ward off invaders, apparently no battles ever occurred and the fort was used more as an administrative and storage base.



Penang National Park

Penang National Park comprises 1,226 hectares of dipterocarp, highlands, mangroves, beaches and rocky coastline. The habitat also includes a rare meromictic lake where fresh and sea water actually meet but interestingly do not mix. The Penang Turtle Sanctuary is also located here.



Cheong Fatt Tze Mansion


Built in the 1880s by the wealthy Cheong Fatt Tze, the award-winning mansion is a combination of Su Chow Dynasty period architecture, English fittings and Art Nouveau stained glass windows, with careful attention to *feng shui*, the Chinese art of geomancy.



Pinang Peranakan Mansion

Originally belonging to Kapitan Chung Keng Quee, the mansion today has been restored and refurbished to its former glory to offer a glimpse of the opulent lifestyle of a rich Peranakan or Straits-born Chinese family as well as their many customs and traditions. With more than 1,000 pieces of artefacts, antiques and collectibles on display, the mansion itself is of eclectic design and architecture.





Pulau Tioman (Tioman Island) is located in the port area of Kuala Rompin, Pahang, Malaysia. It is a resort island that has been gazetted as a marine park where marine activities are subject to the provisions of the law by the Department of Marine Parks.

The main jetty on Pulau Tioman Pier Passenger Terminal is Kampung Tekek where it is the driving force of Tioman with various facilities such as airports, banks, government offices, health clinics, education complex and shops. Apart from Kampung Tekek, there are also other jetties that have been built by the government in Kampung Mukut, Kampung Juara, Kampung Genting, Kampung Paya, Kampung Salang and Kampung Air Batang.

Pulau Tioman also provides marina facilities where yachts and private boats can dock with minimum charges for facilities used. In addition, Star Cruises vessels also make Tioman as a stopover destination.

The unit of currency is the Malaysian Ringgit, which is denoted as RM. Foreign currencies can be converted at banks and money changers.

WORKING DAYS

Most states observe Monday to Friday as working days while Saturday and Sunday are rest days. In the states of Johor, Kedah, Kelantan and Terengganu, working days are from Sunday to Thursday. Friday and Saturday are observed as rest days. This applies to government offices and many private establishments.

BANKING HOURS

In most states, banks are open from Monday to Friday from 9.15 am to 4.30 pm. In Kelantan and Terengganu, banks are closed on Friday and Saturday. Check the websites of the relevant banks for details on operating hours and rest days. Online banking services are available.

POST OFFICES

Post offices are open from 8.30 am to 5.00 pm daily except on Sunday and public holidays. They are open for half—a-day on Saturday (until 1.00 pm). Post offices that are located in shopping malls have extended operating hours. In the states of Johor, Kedah, Kelantan and Terengganu, post offices are closed on Friday and Saturday.

TIME

The standard Malaysian time is eight hours ahead of GMT and 16 hours ahead of the U.S. Pacific Standard Time.

ELECTRICITY

The voltage used throughout Malaysia is 220 - 240 volts AC, at 50 cycles per second. Standard 3-pin square plugs and sockets are used.

MEASUREMENT SYSTEM

Malaysia uses the metric system.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS

Malaysia is linked nationally and internationally by telephone, facsimile and via the Internet. Most hotels provide International Direct Dial (IDD) telephone services and Wi-fi Internet connection.

GETTING TO MALAYSIA

The main gateway to Malaysia is through the Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) in Sepang. It is located about 50 km south of Kuala Lumpur. Over 40 international airlines fly into the country while the national carrier, Malaysia Airlines, has a global network that spans six continents. The airline is a full-fledged member of oneworld, one of the world's top three airline alliances. The national carrier is complemented by its subsidiary, Firefly and the budget airline, AirAsia. Rayani Air is Malaysia's first Syariah-compliant airline. It is based in Langkawi and serves five destinations; KLIA2, Langkawi, Kota Bharu, Kota Kinabalu and Kuching. The new KLIA 2, situated about 1.5 km away from the main terminal of KLIA, is the world's largest purpose-built terminal dedicated to low-cost carriers. Airlines that operate from KLIA2 include AirAsia, AirAsia X and Malindo Air. Other major international airports that serve as entry points are situated in Penang, Johor Bahru, Kuching, Kota Kinabalu and the island of Langkawi. The main entry point to Malaysia by sea is Port Klang, about 50 km away from Kuala Lumpur. Malaysia is also accessible by rail and road from Singapore and Thailand.

GETTING AROUND

Malaysia has excellent domestic air links serviced by Malaysia Airlines as well as carriers such as AirAsia and Firefly. The country has a well-developed and efficient public transportation system served by buses, taxis as well as trains.

ACCOMMODATION

Malaysia has a wide range of accommodation with competitive rates. International star-rated hotels, boutique hotels, beach resorts, chalets, youth hostels and timeshare apartments are among the types of accommodation available.


